

Getting to Know the Board

Veronica Westurn, Treasurer

As you know, I have been your Treasurer for over two and a half years. This will be my last year as Treasurer and the hat will be passed in December. If you would be interested in contributing to your Guild in this capacity, please contact me. It is not a hard or complicated job. It does take a little time; but, I have it set up so that it will be easy to take over. Enough with the recruiting....I have been asked to tell you about me.

I was born in Brooklyn, NY and attended grade school and high school there. I went to work at the Hanover Bank on Wall Street after graduating high school at the age of 16. The Bank was a wonderful training period in my life. It was where I learned to work with numbers. It seems whatever job I have had over the last 40 years or so, the skills I learned at the bank have come into play. At the age of 19, I left the Bank and took a secretarial course. I then joined a Commodity Brokerage Firm, also on Wall Street. I worked as an executive secretary for the Director of Economic Research. It involved lots of statistical work. I became fascinated with the futures market and the economics of the business and enrolled at Pace College on Broadway to take courses in Economics. But I have always been a little bit of right brain and left brain, all mixed up. In addition to my Economics courses I also signed up for Art History. I loved going back to school. After the first semester I transferred to New York University to continue my studies. I was fortunate that my company supported me and paid the bill. By that time I had moved to the upper Eastside of Manhattan and was sharing an apartment with girlfriends. Those were good years.... working during the day at a good job, going to school at night and playing on the upper east side with roommates and friends.

I met my first husband at the beach in South Hampton where my friends and I would go every summer. In October of 1968, we married and moved to San Francisco. I had first visited S.F. when I was 20 and for seven years my dream was to move there.

I got a job with Dean Witter on Montgomery Street and worked as secretary to the Partner in charge of Broker Training. He didn't have much secretarial work and so I took all the Broker courses and helped with the teaching program.

In 1970, we moved to Palo Alto and I changed jobs. I went to work for a company that had several hundred small retail stores located across America. After a short time, I became the regional Personal Director for the west coast. When the management split off and formed their own West Coast Company, I joined them as their Director of Human Resources. I also had the responsibility of setting up and conducting their training programs. I learned to love to teach again. During this time of life and job changes, I continued going to school at night at the University of San Francisco and got my BSBA degree in 1978, Since it was a requirement for my job, I was happy to graduate.

I separated from my first husband in 1979 and met David, my husband of 34 years now, at a beach party in Cancun Mexico in

1980. We married in 1982 and moved to Southern CA. Another life change and another job change. I went to work for Aerojet Ordnance Company in Downey, CA as secretary to the Contract Manager. I needed to learn the language and took a Government Contracting Certificate Program course at the University of CA. I got several promotions in a short time and I wound up as Manager of Administration for the Warheads Group with responsibility for all the government proposal work and the cost/schedule/status reports on our government programs, as well as, the Admin and Budget work for the Dept. It was a great job and I loved it. Again..... I was surrounded by numbers.

My husband was transferred to Australia in 1989 and I had to leave Aerojet. I loved living in Australia. I got to travel all over Australia and New Zealand and it was great not working for the first time in my life.

We moved back to America in 1991 and settled in Fort Worth, TX for a year and then back to southern CA. I wanted to do something different and joined Prudential in a training program for financial advisors. I studied and got my Life and Health License and my Series 6 License with the SEC. I did financial planning and sales for a year or so and then moved into a more administration job in-house for the next several years. I loved the business but I didn't like selling.

In the meantime we had moved to Huntington Beach, CA and I rejoined the Newport Sailing Club and started sailing again. I loved ocean sailing with my club friends. At least once a month we would take a boat to Catalina. Several times I went with them on trips to the British Virgin Islands to sail the trade winds.

In 2003, my husband retired and we moved to Henderson, NV to a Del Webb retirement community overlooking the Las Vegas strip. We lived there for nine years and it was fun.

In 2011 we took a vacation to Branson and stayed at Big Cedar. We fell in love with the lake and came back the following summer and bought a lot and built our cabin overlooking the lake. Not too long after moving here in 2012 I joined Neighbors and Friends and met some of the people there who also belong to our Guild.
