President Jan Rosenburg opened the meeting at 12:27 p.m. and Don Haberman offered a prayer for the group. Jan then thanked all for coming and expressed appreciation that everyone was using masks as mandated by the Church.

Minutes: On motion (Helen Long/Donna Gillespie) the minutes of the June 15 TRAG meeting were duly approved as printed in the Newsletter.

Sunshine: Jan noted that our Sunshine Lady, Pat Van Hooser, is staying home. Pat shared that David Carver is recuperating in the Specialty Select Hospital in Springfield and would appreciate cards. Paula Buzenius's mother is stable for now.

Membership: Darlene Rutz – We have 62 total active members with one new member, Mike Bachelder who is Mary Friedman's husband and now down here fulltime. We are saddened that another recent member, Mark Fisher, died. There are 18 present at today's meeting.

Art Festival – Jan O'Neill: Jan invited volunteers to help with our "Spring" show tentatively scheduled for April 23 and 24, 2021. There are several criteria members need to fulfill to be in the annual art show without paying a \$50 fee. The criteria are listed in the TRAG Yearbook, copies of which are here to pick up.

Pandora's Box: Brenda Vivieros: Brenda explained the process reminding members that whatever was in their box could be incorporated into a piece of art or the art could be inspired by it. The initial judging will be at our August meeting. The entries will be posted in the Gallery and the public may vote on their 1st, 2nd, and 3rd choices, too. The combined votes of the members at the meeting and the public votes will be tallied and the "winners" will receive cash awards and be announced at the September meeting.

Gallery – Jan R. reported that Helen has vouchers for two months free panel donation for those members that kept their work in the Gallery during the time it was closed. She also thanked all for hanging in there and reported that City Hall is working on locating the bowling alley landlord to address the water leakage problems. For those sitting the Gallery, be sure if patrons are writing checks for their purchases that they write out Table Rock Art Gallery, not just TRAG, on the check so that the bank will deposit it in the correct account. Jan also reminded members that the Guild has an excellent art resource library at the Gallery that is available to all members. Books and/or DVDs may be checked out for one month. For the rest of the year, the Gallery will have a weekly drawing on Friday mornings for a \$5 or \$10 piece of art.

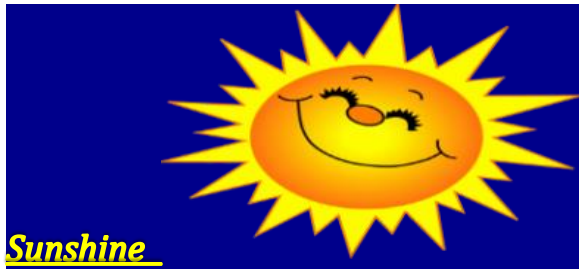
