Jan R. called for the motion to approve the January minutes. Helen long made the motion to approve the January minutes. Shirley Lacore 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. Motion carried.

**Treasurer's report** is posted in the gallery office.

**Programs:** Helen announced that next month's program is going to be a surprise due to Scott Stowell being detained from leaving the states due to Covid. He was supposed to present a program on his travels.

Helen also explained that we were going to have the Festival of Arts in the fall as we always have. We had changed it to a spring show due to the Covid outbreak, but due to continued issues with Covid it has now been moved back to Fall. Pat Hovis-French announced that she had received an inquiry about the show and questioned when the dates were going to be. She added that the inquiry expressed how much they had enjoyed the show in the past and were looking forward to attending again. Jan Rosenburg explained what the Festival of Art Show is, who is eligible to enter, how much work is involved.

**Sunshine:** Helen Long reported that Larry Custer had a total knee replacement and is recovering.

**Membership:** 52 members to date.

**Children's Art Show:** March 25 thru the 28<sup>th</sup>. For those who are displaying in the Gallery you need to have your artwork out of the Gallery by Tuesday the 23<sup>rd</sup>. Will be doing the matting on the Wednesday the 24<sup>th</sup> at 10:00. Lunch will be provided by Jan Rosenburg. Still need some more members to show up on Saturday since that is

when we have our influx of people. Thanks for everyone who is volunteering!

**Workshop:** The PhotoShop workshop being presented by Paula Buzenius is limited to six participants. It will be held on April 13<sup>th</sup> for a cost of \$20.00 at the Gallery.

**Meet and Greet:** Jan Rosenburg announced that we will be starting our Meet and Greet on the first Friday in June. She asked that when signing up, at least two, but better yet three people sign up to do a Meet and Greet together. ## Meet this Month's TRAG Artist

Yvonne Thurman -

I was raised in northwest Alabama, a small town nestled between the Tennessee River, Tuscumbia, and Muscle Shoals.

I was married and had 3 boys when my mother called and asked us to move to Missouri and work for her.

We did and I became a waitress at the then, Cove Resort and Restaurant. We later went to work for Silver Dollar City for about 3 or 4 seasons. I loved the craft festival, and every break I got, I went out and watched the artist's paint. I do not remember any jewelry makers there, but I always loved jewelry.

I had always wanted to become an LPN and hopefully work in a Dr's office. I heard they were needing help at Skaggs Hospital, so I put in an application and got the job. I lost my husband, and with what little life insurance he had, I decided it was time for me to go to school. Down the road, my new husband who had taken an art class in college talked me into trying to paint, so I played around with it for a while. I joined TRAG, but between working and raising 3 boys, I just did not have time to put into it.

Years later after I had retired, we were at the SDC festival and I got the bright idea that it would be fun to make necklaces for the girls in my family. I asked a lady who was making jewelry if she gave lessons, and she agreed to do so. At my first lesson she said, "I was a natural", and she could not believe how well my first piece turned out. That was in 2016, and I have not stopped making jewelry since. She and I have become great friends.

I work from my home and I had to change half of our computer room/library into my workspace. I love working with metal and clays and cannot believe some of the things I have come up with, nor the fact that people think they are so beautiful and different. Especially since 99% of my work comes from in my head.
